BEFORE YOU GO: checklist for at least **few weeks before** your outbound flight

| What you need to do | How to do it |
|---|---|
| <p>Check the entry requirements for the country you're jetting off to.</p> <p>TIP: Sign-up to email travel alerts on the FCDO website to stay up-to-date with the latest advice.</p> | <p>Head to the FCDO website https://www.gov.uk/foreign-travel-advice</p> |
| <p>Make sure you have proof of your vaccination status (if required).</p> <p>TIP: Some destinations and entry requirements will require you to show proof of being double vaccinated.</p> | <p>Download the NHS App on Apple and Android devices.</p> <p>Don't have a smartphone? Don't worry! Call 119 to request a paper copy of your vaccination status. Please note this can take at least 5 days to arrive.</p> |
| <p>Book your PCR tests (these may be required as part of the entry requirements for your holiday destination).</p> <p>TIP: You can also book your lateral flow tests for returning back to the UK and for when you're back home.</p> | <p>Head to the FCDO website to check if you need a PCR test to enter https://www.gov.uk/foreign-travel-advice</p> <p>Book your Covid-19 tests (Government approved providers). https://www.netflights.com/information/covid-test</p> |
| <p>Check all passports have at least six months validity left on them.</p> | <p>Simply check the expiry date on your passport. If you have less than six months before your passport expires, you'll need to apply for a new passport. Without this you will not be allowed to travel.</p> |
| <p>Book Travel Insurance and check that your cover is sufficient.</p> | <p>We've great deals here https://netflightsinsurance.com/travel-insurance/single-trip</p> |
| <p>Consider booking any holiday essentials like Airport Parking or Airport Transfers, that may help keep your holiday stress-free.</p> | <p>Check out our range of holiday essentials at SUPER low prices. https://www.netflights.com/information/holiday-extras</p> |

BEFORE YOU GO: checklist for **few days before** your outbound flight

| What you need to do | How to do it |
|---|---|
| Take your PCR test and send off for results. The entry requirements for your holiday destination may require you to take a PCR test and present a negative test result for travel so it's important you get this done in time. | Your test kit will have instructions on how to take the test and how to send off for results. Thoroughly follow the instructions and guide from your test provider. |
| Download your proof of vaccination status from the NHS App. | Follow the instructions on the App to download a PDF copy of your vaccination status. Alternatively, you can send yourself a copy via email and print off to show where necessary. TIP: We recommend doing both! If you applied for a letter as proof of vaccination status, make sure you have it in time and keep it at hand somewhere safe, like inside your passport. |
| Complete the Passenger Locator Form for the country you're entering. | Find the form you need by visiting either: The FCDO website https://www.gov.uk/foreign-travel-advice Our SUPER handy advisory tool https://www.netflights.com/information/covid-travel-req |

Covid-19 travel checklists

BEFORE YOU GO: checklist before you leave home for your outbound flight

TIP: Remember to get to the airport nice and early! With PPE procedures and new travel essential checks, it can take a little longer to get checked-in and to get through security, so you'll want to give yourself plenty of time.

| Check that you have the following | |
|-----------------------------------|---|
| | Valid passports and any visas that may be required |
| | Boarding passes (if you have them) |
| | Proof of vaccination status (if required) |
| | Proof of negative PCR test result (if required) |
| | Links to your completed Passenger Locator Form (PLF) for the country you're going to. |
| | Return Covid-19 testing kits (if you have pre-ordered these to take away with you) |

WHILE YOU'RE ABROAD: checklist for 72hrs before your return flight home

| | What you need to do | How to do it |
|--|---|--|
| | Complete your return PCR tests (if required). | <p>If you have ordered a PCR test kit to take with you on holiday, follow the instructions given by your test provider.</p> <p>If you're arranging a PCR test whilst on holiday, follow the information provided to you at time of booking. Find the relevant form https://www.find-travel-test-provider.service.gov.uk/test-type/green</p> |
| | Complete the Passenger Locator Form for your return to the UK. | <p>Complete form here https://www.gov.uk/provide-journey-contact-details-before-travel-uk</p> <p>TIP: Have your NHS number, test receipt number and passport information to hand. You'll need this for everyone who is travelling home in your party.</p> |

WHILE YOU'RE ABROAD: checklist before you leave for return flight home

| Check that you have the following | |
|-----------------------------------|--|
| | Valid passports and any visas that may be required |
| | Boarding passes (if you have them) |
| | Proof of vaccination status via the NHS App or official letter |
| | Proof of negative PCR test result taken within the required pre-flight timeframe (if required) |
| | Links to your completed Passenger Locator Form (PLF) for return back into the UK. |

BACK HOME: checklist for when you are back home in the UK

| What you need to do | How to do it |
|--|---|
| Take a PCR/lateral flow test on or before Day 2 of returning home (where required) | To find out whether you will be required to take this test head to the FCDO website https://www.gov.uk/guidance/travel-to-england-from-another-country-during-coronavirus-covid-19 |
| Take a PCR test on Day 8 of returning home (if you are not fully vaccinated). You may also take a 'test to release' PCR test on day 5 to end your quarantine period earlier. | To find out whether you will be required to take this test head to the FCDO website https://www.gov.uk/guidance/travel-to-england-from-another-country-during-coronavirus-covid-19 |
